#### Happy 28th Birthday RECHOG

On June 2, 1988 the first meeting of the newly formed chapter of H.O.G. was held at Michael's Harley-Davidson in Santa Rosa (4780 Sonoma HWY). There were 10 people present to help get this chapter off to a good start. Several names were suggested and the title of "Redwood Empire" was voted in as the name of this chapter. Bylaws which were drawn up and furnished by the Harley-Davidson Motor Co. were read to all people present. The meeting was chaired by Michael Leskar, and at this time several of the offices needed to run a local H.O.G. chapter have been filled by volunteers, Sue Phelps was Secretary Treasurer and Victor Stupansky was Road Captain. Sam Marovich was eventually elected as their first Director. It was decided by the people present that the best time to hold the local H.O.G. meetings would be the 1st Thursday of every month at 8pm. The Charter was effective on August 29th 1988. Under the direction of Sam, the chapter began attending other H.O.G. functions, gaining momentum and growing in membership. In December the Redwood Empire Chapter held their first Toy Run and the first Christmas Party was held at Shooters West in Santa Rosa. By March of 1989, membership had grown to over 50 members. The Chapter was holding, monthly brunch runs, attending regional rallies, gearing up the Redwood Run and making plans for their first MDA Benefit. The Redwood Empire Chapter of the Harley Owners Group was definitely on its way. (Reprinted from August 2009 Tales from the Woods)

We have had a long history of riding and having fun. We have an amazing chapter with numerous rides and events to choose from weekly. If you are looking for someone to ride with, this is the place to be. With the assimilation of social media our connection

#### **Highway Runaways**

PORTLAND, Ore. (JUNE 30, 2015) – Harley-Davidson is celebrating 100 years of strong and confident women riders by supporting renowned photographer and motorcyclist Lana MacNaughton and the Highway Runaways Ride. Distinguished for her "Women's Moto Exhibit," MacNaughton is leading four of her closest female friends on a cross-



country Harley-Davidson motorcycle journey, starting July 3, when she kicks off the ride in Brooklyn, New York. This four-week tour will end in San Francisco.

The Highway Runaways Ride is inspired by the infamous Avis and Effie Hotchkiss ride in 1915, when the mother and daughter became the first women to ride their Harley-Davidson motorcycle across the U.S. Many women have blazed their own trail in the sport of motorcycling, and MacNaughton leads a modern-day celebration of how women riders are unleashing their rebellious spirit and living life on their terms. Like the Hotchkiss ride 100 years ago, the Highway Runaways Ride is also being powered by Harley-Davidson. Specializing in the photography of the modern-day female motorcyclists, MacNaughton has dedicated her career to capturing and revealing the courageous and beautiful women who live to ride. During the 4,500-mile trek, McNaughton will collect stories from women riders and take photographs of those who share her passion for the open road. "This ride embodies the spirit of strong and powerful women. Riding a Harley is about escaping the authority and the structure of mundane life; running away is our dream and it has now become our reality," MacNaughton says.

Through the Highway Runaways Ride, MacNaughton and her friends are exhibiting their freedom and independence on two-wheels, and they aren't the only ones riding Harleys to exhibit their strong and powerful spirit. In a survey commissioned by Harley-Davidson,

a majority of women riders said that motorcycling made them happier, more confident and feel sexier. MacNaughton is providing a glimpse into motorcycling on these terms, using her camera to capture experiences along way.
