

The harley Davidson Electra Glide!

The 2015 model year marked the 50th Anniversary of the Harley-Davidson Electra Glide. But, the bike didn't just appear out of thin air in 1965. A new version of the "Knucklehead" engine was offered for the 1941 model year, and the motorcycle designated "FL." In 1949 an all-new telescopic hydraulic front fork began to replace the old "springer" front end, and the bike eventually became commonly called the Hydra Glide. For 1958, rear suspension was added and the name changed to Duo Glide. The next big improvement came in 1965 with the addition of an electric starter. The name Electra Glide was a perfect fit. Wrestling with a kick start engine would become a thing of the past. As the 1965 sales brochure read, "We've taken a few of the kicks away, but none we thought you would miss." A new era was dawning for the rider who had miles to cover. With their removable windshields and hard



iconic H-D touring motorcycle that carries into the present day. Within four years of the introduction, designers crafted an accessory fairing specifically for the Electra Glide to keep more wind off of the rider. The "windshield fairing kit," as it was first listed in 1969 became a standard feature for 1971. It's more commonly known today as the "Batwing" fairing.

Numerous features now accepted as standard on H-D motorcycles were first used in the touring models, such as disc brakes and electronic fuel injection. It was with that spirit that the Project Rushmore upgrades for the 2014 came to fruition. The Batwing fairing was redesigned to reduce buffeting, but the classic shape remained. Saddlebags and Tour Pak were streamlined while increasing capacity. These features and many others marked the single largest product launch in Harley-Davidson history. The importance of the Electra Glide goes far beyond its versatility and popularity. It is the modern standard for touring motorcycles. Competitors have increasingly tried to copy everything from the fairing to the luggage units, but always missing the mark. H-D remains the dominant force in North American touring and is gaining ground in other nations.

Thinking Three Wheels

Are three wheels in your future? Or are three wheels your current ride? The Tri Glide, one wheel forward two wheels aft (early trikes were often propelled by the ever popular VW 1600cc engine in the day) has become more and more popular. In 2008, Harley-Davidson the industries leader in large touring bikes announced that it would enter the market with the Tri Glide, working with a smaller company called Lehman Trikes. In 2010, Harley moved its production in house. The Tri Glide is now a consistent top 10 seller in several demographic groups. Industry experts say the sale of tens of thousands of Tri Glides, whose sticker price that can now rival the upscale sedan has helped stall a slumping industry and kept a generation of born-to-run riders (the baby boomers) on the roads as we are aging.

Riding the Tri Glide is very similar to riding a regular two wheeled motorcycle? Well, a lot of the controls are very similar, but there are one or two differences, one you can't lean around corners for one thing. If you're used to riding a two wheel Harley, then a Tri Glide won't make such a big difference to you? Not so true! Some training experts find it easier to train a new rider on a three wheeler because of the lack of two wheel experience, but one thing is for sure "it's a much different kettle of fish to driving a car"

Top 5 Rules to riding the Tri-Glide

First Rule: Never, ever, put your feet down. There are three wheels, so you won't tip over. But most certainly you can "mouse trap" your feet under the body or rear wheels so this will not be an enjoyable experience.

Second Rule: All Tri Glides have a hand brake, just like the one in your car, and you must release it before moving out. Tri Glides don't have a kickstand, there's nothing but the hand brake to keep the three wheel beauty from rolling into Grandma's Corvette.

Third Rule: The wheelbase of a Tri Glide is about the same as that of the two-wheeler, but because of its bodywork, it's slightly longer and a whole lot wider. To determine just how wide, once seated, stretch out your arms, that's the width you must allow for proper and safe cornering.

Fourth Rule: The Tri Glide involves "direct steering" instead of "counter steering." Point the front wheel into the direction of travel, lock your outside elbow into the turn, and then roll on the throttle through the turn. This differs from a two-wheeler where you counter steer and lean through a corner. Using the Point, Lock, and Roll system, you will go into, and out of, every type of corner quicker than when riding any comparable two-wheeler. Point, Lock, and Roll system increases confidence from not having to brake or steer around light road debris, such as sand and gravel.

Fifth Rule: Always use both front and rear brakes. On a two-wheeler, your rear brakes are 30 percent of your stopping power. On a trike, though, two rear wheels mean twice the stopping power, so you don't want to override your front wheel. Even in panic stops, the trike stops quickly and keeps straight. As experienced riders, we can bring a number of habits and expectations from riding two wheels, all of which must be unlearned. There are a lot of preconceived notions that tend to be inaccurate and are led by the lack of knowledge. But the bottom line is this, whether you're 75 years old, or whether you were born in 1975, the Tri Glide is for anybody who wants performance, comfort, and the perpetual grin. So test drive a Tri Glide to understand what the big deal is all about, you certainly won't regret it.


I will be leading my first ride on February 24th. I will be taking you along some of my favorite backroads in Sebastopol (some of which


