

Over Packing

Well I think summer has arrived. The reason I mentioned over packing is that we are having to carry different amounts of clothing for a day of riding. I was at a motorcycle shop a few weeks ago and ran into a guy that made the local news. He was the rider that had an accident caused by some clothes that he bungeed to the back of his bike slipped off the fender into his chain. The next thing he and is passenger knew was they were sliding down the road. He ended up with bruised ribs and a few broken bike parts. His passenger was OK. Please make sure to pack everything securely.

The other item I mentioned at the last meeting was something Ian, Sergio and I ran into in Laughlin. It is called Lightning Strike. It is a pair of lights that mount to the engine guard and a button that mounts near your horn button. When you push the button the two bright white lights strobe very fast to get the other drivers attention. The demonstration was amazing. Take a look at their web site for a demonstration. www.getlightningstrike.com. It is one of the most amazing safety products I have ever seen.






