

The Importance of hydration

As the weather slowly (and I mean slowly) begins to be headed to the summer months and great riding weather its time to recap the importance of hydration while ridding.

As I ride, I see many riders who are in short sleeves and or the bear minimum to stay cool while on a ride is the first step to dehydration. Direct exposure to the sun, high temperatures, and high humidity can all contribute to dehydration while on a ride.

Proper hydration is the key while ridding because dehydration is the single most cause of fatigue, dizziness and confusion, which could easily cause you to crash. Other symptoms of dehydration could include mental fogginess, slower reaction time, bad decision making, shallow breathing, and low blood pressure.

If its hot outside and you are not sweating, this is the first sign of dehydration and nearing heat stroke. Dehydration has a cumulative effect your body and it doesn't magically hydrate itself without drinking the proper amounts of water. Just like a radiator, it does not refill its own coolant. So if you are 5% percent dehydrated on Friday, and don't drink enough water to become full hydrated again, then on Saturday you don't drink enough water once again, you will be at least 5% dehydrated from Friday plus whatever you loose on Saturday. This compounding rule is going to be your worst nightmare when you aren't hydrating properly.

To remain hydrated on a long ride in the worst of temperatures start by hydrating your body 24 hours before the ride. The old rule of 8 glasses of water a day depending on your body size you may need more or less. A better rule is to take your body weight in pounds and divide it by 2 for the number of ounces of water you should be drinking every day. Caffeinated drinks like coffee, soda or even energy drinks will actually dehydrate you even more because the caffeine acts as a diuretic, which is a substance that actually pushes the water from your body.

The quickest way to loose fluids from your body while ridding is to have your skin bare to the heat of the sun, the high humidity or dry air, and the wind blowing over your skin called wicking. Wearing a proper lightweight jack plus cooling vest underneath gives great comfort to the body and helps retain your body's moisture. The third most important part of this is not to forget your head. I know in some states that there is no requirement for a helmet and the helmet in this case actually slows the wicking of moisture from your hair. Dehydration while out on a ride happens fast and if you don't listen to your body and to the warning signs it's sending out you will find yourself in fast trouble. Be smart and take the necessary steps to staying hydrated.

As always keep the rubber side down and the shiny side up Vincent Mulligan, Safety Officer

THE ALL NEW RIDE 365

Ride 365 is HOG's Official Mileage Recognition Program for 2018 which includes the Lifetime Mileage Recognition Program (which most HOG Members have joined) but has two new mileage programs built into it.

The Annual Mileage Recognition (which is an individual mileage program) rewards HOG Members throughout the year for meeting various mileage milestones (very similar to the Lifetime Mileage Program). The Annual Chapter Challenge Mileage Program makes things a little interesting by adding a competitive element among HOG Chapters. Each Chapter Member that is signed up for the *Ride365* is eligible for the Annual Chapter Challenge as all Chapter Members Mileage is added to a total Chapter Mileage. There two elements to this program a Highest Total Mileage and a Highest Average Mileage per Member where one chapter could win one or both. Both these new programs start January 1st of every year and runs through December 31st and you validate your mileage at any HD Dealership.


