Tire Failure...and Manufacture Defect isn't one of them!

Nothing is more "Frustrating" than a tire failure or tire problem requiring and unplanned, early replacement of a new tire. We often think that when this happens the issue was most likely a "Tire Defect" when the tire was (born) manufactured, but often this is not the case in 99% of tire failures. Manufacturing defect, poor quality, or poor materials are rarely the case of tire failures when you are purchasing high quality tires from a reputable tire dealer and installed properly. 99% of the time, the cause of a tire failure leading to a possible blow-out or pre-mature tire replacement was completely avoidable with a little more care and attention during routine maintenance or while riding. Riding while your tires are *under inflated* is one of the main causes of tire failures. Tires that are under inflated flex more in the side wall, excessive flexing causes the side wall to heat up beyond normal operating temperatures. This problem is compounded while riding during "Hot Weather" at freeway speeds during long periods of time or riding the twisties. When tires get excessively hot, the rubber begins to degrade, which if driven long enough, will lead to tire side wall cracking, splitting, or tread separation and then tire side wall failure.

Road hazards, if you are riding at 50-60 mph (two up or single rider bike loaded) and you hit a pothole or run over a road obstacle the tires take the full brunt of the impact. If the impact was hard enough, the side wall of the tire will compress and will be squeezed between the object and the wheel flange. This is called "Pinch Shock" and can cause a chunk of tire to come off or a large crack to begin to form in the inside wall of the tire where the cords have been broken and lead to a side wall bubble. Why is the side wall of a tire so important? Front Tire Side wear is a normal band of wear evident on the sides of the tires at the most common lean angle for that motorcycle. It is caused by the interaction of the pavement and the tires in a turn. When you turn, your bike really wants to go straight (Newton's First Law of Motion). You apply a force to make a turn, because of your wise desire to stay on the curving road. The bike's desire is to keep going straight, the natural and inertial centrifugal force in this interaction and the force resisting the inertia making the bike turn to follow the road is the Centripetal force.

The rear tire of a motorcycle is where most of the load of the bike is stored, and if the bike is being constantly over loaded with under inflated tires then you are over-taxing the rear tire!

Rec-hog history:


In the years 2000 and 2001 Michael Loomis was the director. And they raffled a new Softail Heritage in pearl white. The proceeds went to help a new Children's Home in Sonoma Co., for which the chapter received a commendation from the County.

On Dec. 24th, 2000 a couple of the Rec-Hog members were seen along side the 101 freeway stomping the stuffing out of a teddy bear! They had started out for the annual toy run to the Valley of the Moon Children's Home. The teddy bear was securely tied to the front of the bike over the headlight. As they rode down the freeway the headlight continued to heat until the teddy bear burst into flames. Upon removal the stomping ensued. This became know as the Tale of The Flaming Teddy Bear.

harley-Davidson history:

In the 1930's the movement was Art Deco, with a fresh use of color and styling. This inspired the company to move away from the green color schemes it had been using as its paint finishes since 1917. And one major new model introduced in 1936 embodied the movement's style and boldness, the 61E "Knucklehead". Although the general economic climate had improved by the mid 1930's, Harley's situation was still uncertain, so the decision to release, what is arguably the most significant model in Harley's history, was a risky one. The technologically advanced "Knucklehead" had a recirculating lubrication system, a four speed gearbox, and overhead valves

with hemispherical combustion chambers. This bike is the direct granddaddy of today's big twins. But it's influence was more than just mechanical. The 1930's was the decade of streamlining, when aerodynamics was not a science but an art statement. The 61E epitomized the streamlined look. It was an integrated style that set the tone for the modern motorcycle.






