

Being Visible Being Seen

Skull styled brake lights may seems like a cool lighting upgrade (and I shake my head when I see it), but it's your decision and your right to do it. Nobody wants to hit a motorcycle rider, but with your Halloween decoration blinking lights and now the winter months getting darker earlier, Being Visible Being Seen is the key to staying out the path of a car or truck. If you plan to do a lighting retrofit, think long and hard about how much safety you want to sacrifice for style.



Every state has rules on the books about what you're allowed to use as brake and directional lights on a motorcycle, but some are "enforced" more than others. In some states such as Massachusetts, requires a "DOT" stamp on the lens, while California will generally take your word for it or not "Blink" an eye. But just because you can ride around with whatever excuse for lights you want doesn't mean you should. Directional and brake lights are some of the most important elements in the "BE Visible Shield" you have on the road as a motorcycle.

LED replacement kits and bulbs are popping up all over the aftermarket, local auto parts, and shops like mushrooms. But like every other accessory they're not all created equal, some are well built and others are just junk. You'll know junk from well built when you see it, but basically if you're replacing an incandescent bulb with LED bulb, you want little diodes pointing in all directions, not just on a flat plane of lights. *Note: this doesn't apply to LED Lights that come with their own housing.*

LED bulbs and incandescent bulbs are going to project light in slightly different directions "Optimal Visibility" is going to happen when the LED's are nestled into reflectors designed for their projection pattern. Using an incandescent reflector with a LED bulb is going to be suboptimal and is a waste of time and money. If you're going to upgrade, make the choice to replace the entire light housing with a manufacture designed for LED if the light is something you depend on to see, like a headlamp. But you can get away with LED's in a stock housing if the primary objective is "being seen" as with blinkers or brakes.

LED's, as you may have heard draw less power than incandescent bulbs which is true and generally that is a good thing for your electrical system as it tends to lighten the load. Be wise before you buy, as many manufactures claims put on their products are simply not true if you are buying "Aftermarket". Be penny wise and have a good plan and outcome if you're going to upgrade your motorcycle lighting.



Pearl Harbor Day, commemorates the Japanese attack on the U.S. Naval base at Pearl Harbor. The attack began at dawn December 7, 1941. It crippled the U.S. Pacific Fleet, and caused the U.S. to enter World War II. During the attack at Pearl Harbor,



over 2,400 American serviceman and 68 civilians were killed. Five of the eight battleships at Pearl Harbor were sunk or sinking, and virtually all ships were damaged. On Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day, U.S. flags are to be flown at half staff. On December 8, 1941 President Franklin D. Roosevelt stated in a speech to Congress it was "...a day that will live in infamy". The U.S. then declared war on Japan.


