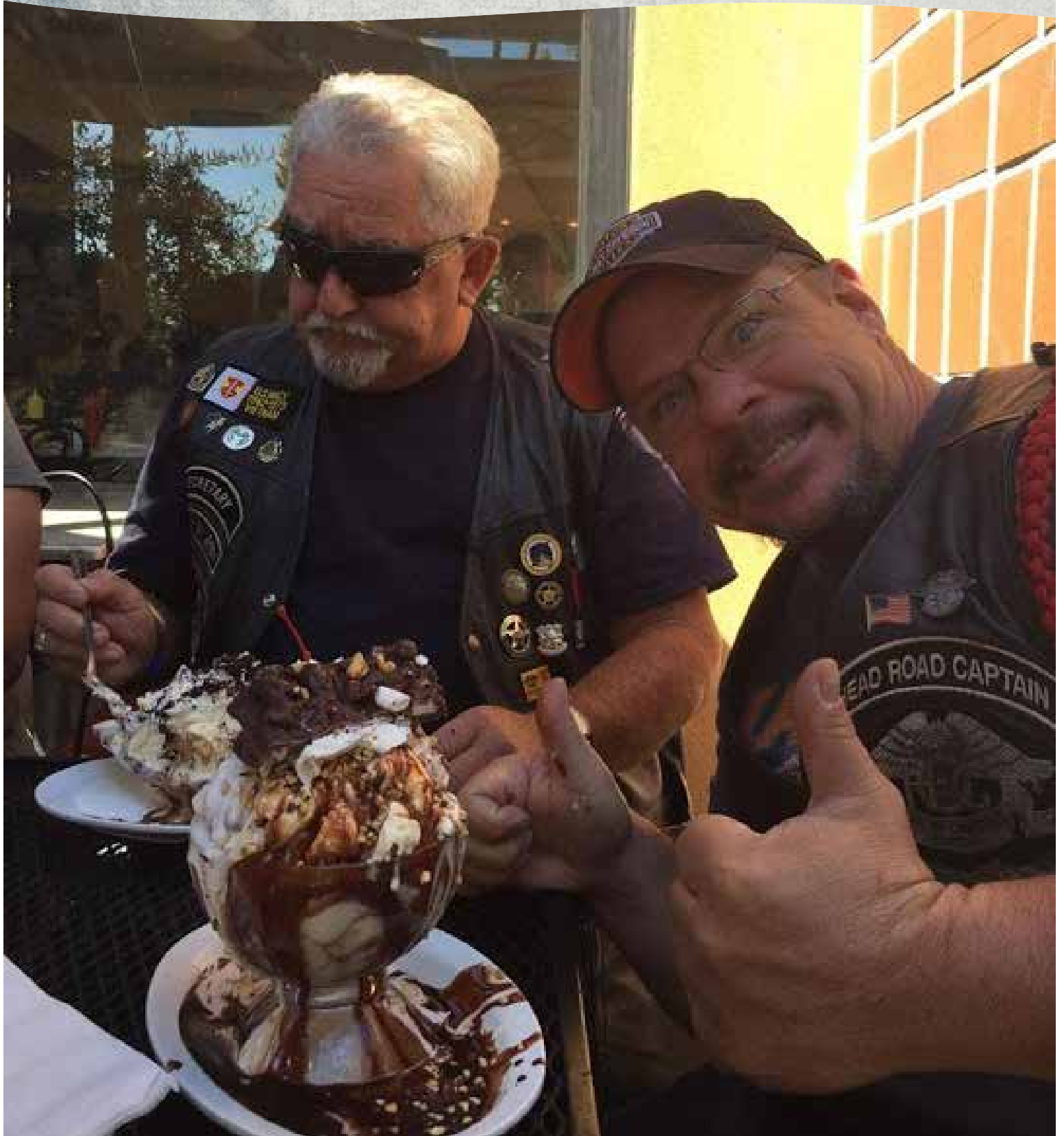

LADIES OF HARLEY

The trip in September up to Happy Camp, and then over to the Greenhorn Creek Guest Ranch was worth every mile (946 on my bike). There was an abrupt beginning for me as I had it in my mind that the meet-up time was at 9:00am. So when at 7:30am, my phone rang and it was Randy asking where I was, I said home, why? That's when I learned we were supposed to leave at 7:30....oh boy. Thankfully, everything was mostly packed and I scrambled to gather everything else and got on the road. I arrived at Bad Ass at about 8:15 and they weren't too angry with me.

It was colder than anticipated. The wind chill and over cast skies kept the bikes cool...and us too. When we were about to Garberville, the sun broke through on occasion. There were just 5 of us, Randy and Conci, me in the middle, and Dan and Helen in the back. We made very good time as a result. We arrived at Happy Camp by around 4:30 I think, which was earlier than expected. We checked into our rooms, wiped down our bikes (from the heavy fog) and made plans to have dinner across the way at the pizza place. It was a quaint little town. The only gas station was an unmanned automated deal, and if you didn't have a credit or debit card, you were out of luck!

While at dinner, we became aware of some commotion outside the restaurant. Officers came in for some beverages and I, of course, had a casual chat with them about other restaurants in the area, etc. We had no idea until after they left, the waitress exclaimed, "Happy Camp ain't so happy tonight. Big pot bust." We finished our pizza and salad

(hand-made and very tasty by one very tatted-up 80-year old lady that was very energetic), and headed outside. There, parked beside the only market, were at least 3, if not 4 huge hauls of marijuana, hanging over the edges of wooden bins (the kind that would haul hay or firewood, maybe). Numerous officers and other authorities were gathered around the trucks, discussing the situation we guessed. We really wanted to get a photo of the haul, but thought better of it. Our hotel was modest, and probably way better than a jail cell.

After leaving Happy Camp, we headed towards Yreka! At about 31 miles south of Ashland, we turned south and eventually connected with Highway 5 (ask Randy for the route details....it was fantastic). When Mt. Shasta came into view, we could see, very clearly, the infamous lenticular cloud formation above its peak. At our fuel/break stop, I asked if we could stop along 5 at some point for a photo of it...when we did stop, the wind was so strong, we could actually see the formation rotating about the summit.



We said farewell to Dan and Helen at the stop...they wanted to head on to Redding. Randy and Conci with me in tow, continued on eastward until we reached our destination at The Greenhorn Creek Guest Ranch. There we met up with Bill and Heidi. The place was beautiful. The ranch house we stayed in was solid wood, no TVs or phones in the rooms.



There was a cook house where we had dinner, breakfast, and lunches, all home-made and delicious, coffee and fruit available all day long and events to keep us entertained each night. The horseback ride was the real highlight. With 600 acres at their disposal, trails could lead to anywhere. The horses knew where to go, though, especially when we got close to the ranch after 2 hours on the trail.

Sunday morning arrived way too soon, so we packed up and left around 9am, anticipating we'd get rained on along the way. We also noted the frost on the grass! Randy commented that he hoped we would be out of the hills before the rain hit, and that's exactly what happened. We rolled through some light shower that didn't last long, but sure dirtied up our bikes.

I arrived in my driveway at about 4:30pm, and after unpacking, spent another 2 hours cleaning off the grime on the wheels and chrome. A really nice trip, Randy, and with all that was offered at the Guest Ranch, it ended up being a bargain after all. Thank you for the adventure.

MEMBER SUBMISSION

I wanted to share my recent experience attending a very worthy event and ceremony. I saw a posting on the RECHOG friends Facebook page about a run taking place on October 12th from the Sebastopol Cemetery to the Sacramento Valley National Cemetery. The information was about the facilitated movement of the remains of four local Veterans thru the Missing In America Project (MIAP) (<http://www.miap.us/>). Two RECHOG Vets and I accompanied the American Legion Riders from Chapter 111 to Dixon where we met up with others from the Patriot Guard Riders. The remains of the Vets were treated with dignity and respect from the procession of the flag draped urns to the motorcycles in Sebastopol and then at the National Cemetery via another ceremoniously flag lined exchange. The VA holds quarterly ceremonies honoring the Fallen Heroes who have no family left to take ownership of them. (*the next is January 11th, 2017* <http://svnnccsc.org>)

The ceremony was held in an outside dedicated area and was attended by several members of the military in uniform, a two person horse contingent, members of the community, and a class of local school children who took turns each reading the 212 names. After each name, rank, branch, and war period were read a ring of the bell followed. A final farewell was given by the American Legion Post 637, a rifle volley and playing of taps by a lone bugler. At the conclusion, the flag was presented to an attending Military General who represented the absent families along with an expression of gratitude and thanks.

Regardless of my own personal views about war and what I want done with my own remains, I thought this honorable expression of respect was fitting and deserving to these Vets who had no one left willing to take this role. All those involved appeared sincere and dedicated to providing a worthy final resting ceremony. I thought it was a great opportunity for the school kids to begin to have an understanding of the military experience and appreciate what others are doing to work towards our protection/freedom. I was personally very honored to have participated in this experience along with two of our own Vets and encourage others to do so in the future.
